"The Fed at 100" illuminates the complex workings of the nation's central bank on its centennial anniversary and explores the pivotal role the Federal Reserve has played throughout the history of American finance. The exhibition includes a unique

visitor experience that provides a firsthand view of the Fed's inner workings, as we invite you to enter and explore the offices of four key players at the Fed: the Chairman of the Board of Governors; a Reserve Bank president; a research assistant; and the Chairman of the Senate Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs Committee.

"The Fed at 100" also features an audio tour of 100 objects representing different facets of the Fed including excerpts from oral histories with Federal Reserve employees – from security guards to executive assistants to senior-level staff.



The "100 Years, 100 Objects" gallery highlights the people behind the institution, as well as key moments in the Fed's history. A gallery is also dedicated to the Federal Reserve Bank of New York, which plays a special role in the Fed System, including implementing monetary policy and supervising some of the nation's largest banks.
